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Head teacher's Blog- What an amazing week we have had at The Arbours! Mrs Rock, Miss Henman and I spent Monday at a leadership meeting planning further improvements for our school and Trust and we have lots of exciting learning opportunities already planned for next academic year. The day ended with a concert which featured 4 of our truly amazing performers in the DRET All Star's choir. Thank you to Miss Osmond and Mrs Taylor who supported the children in this.

Miss Appleby and I spent Wednesday working at another Trust school to work on developing the Talk For Writing strategy and action planning to ensure our children achieve their full potential in writing.

Thursday was a very exciting day for some of our children (and staff!) who attended the DRET Summer Cup.

Today, after school, the PTA are holding a movie night for EYFS/ KS1 which will be very exciting for our children. Thank you to parents who are involved in the pTA- this is something I am keen to expand and develop. If you are interested in supporting us and joining the PTA, please let me know! Reception: Hi everyone! It was lovely seeing so many of you enjoying the summer fair last Friday! The kids were excited to tell me how they had spent their weekend in that glorious bit of sunshine we had! Our time together is precious now as we come to end of the year - we've been looking back at all the fun times we've had in Reception this week, and the things we have learned about! The children wrote about their favourite memories in their literacy books! We've been recapping time in maths! The children have been learning all about the chain of leaders that look after our country, starting with the Queen and parliament! On Friday we are hopefully having a visitor in the afternoon - the Mayor of Northampton! (the Queen was busy so I went for a leader closer to home haha!). The children are very excited and we've been discussing questions we could ask him! We held our weekly class prime minister vote on Monday - well done to Eli for getting the most votes! Don't forget Sports Day has now been changed to the 12th July - hope to see you all there!

Year 1: The children have had another lovely week! We have been finishing off our story in English and have started to complete our hot write. In maths we have been learning about capacity, perhaps the children could should you what they have learnt at home. We are looking forward to sports day next week and hope to see you all there.

Year 2: This week year 2 have continued to work hard and have had lots of fun. We have been carrying out lots of investigations in maths, with the children experimenting with mass and volume. In English, the children have completed another fantastic hot write. Children have continued to look at electrical circuits in science and have been trying to build their own working circuits.

Year 3: In Year 3 we have been working really hard as it is test time. It was nice to get back to normal. In English we wrote list of ingredients to make different magic potions. In math, 3HB have been solving word problems and 3ZH have been busy with fractions. We have also been exploring Queen Elizabeth I life and what she achieved.

Year 4: This week year four are continuing to learn about losing tales in English and will complete their own Independent application. Students will be revising some materials covered throughout the year in data handling. In Science students will carrying out some fair test experiments. Students will also complete our last topic in History on the glorious revolution.

Year 5: It has been assessment week in Year 5 with the children showing off everything that they have learnt this year. We have been really impressed with the perseverance that the children have shown when trying to solve some of complicated maths problems that they encountered. In reading we have been looking at an extract from Wonder and exploring the language that has been used the reading between the lines. In English, we have been using a futuristic version of Little Red Riding Hood to explore warning tales before trying to create some of our own next week. In history, we have been looking at the slave trade and have some mature conversations about what happened and how we feel about it. We will complete that topic next week by looking at when and how slavery was abolished.

Year 6: This week, the children have been treated to trips and special guests coming into our school talking about money, budgeting, transition days and sport at Secondary School. In reading, it is our last been studying short films, answering a range of questions and looking at Secret Life of Pets 2. In mathematics, we have continued with business and money with lessons focusing on payslips. Finally, in the afternoons this week, we have been practicing our play for the 'end of year performance' that will be on the 18th July from 2:15pm until 3:15pm.
